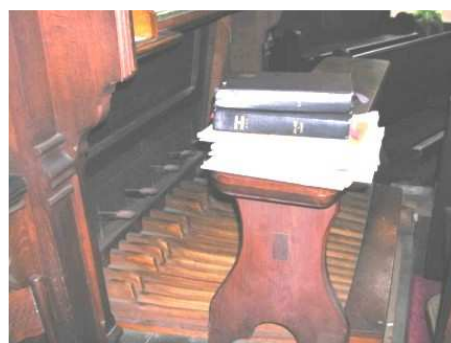

The organ was installed second hand in the church in 1911. The nameplate says Henry Dyer & Son, London, who is assumed to have built it c1878.

The instrument has been regularly maintained. It is playable, with a good sound, and very satisfactory for leading congregational singing.

The organ is in need of considerable attention. Several of the Trumpet pipes have collapsed.

Organ is now redundant due to chapel closure and is available from the beginning of March 2008.
